

tional trauma and distress. As of June, 2020, over 250,000 quilts have been awarded throughout the U.S. and overseas. From Jan 1, 2020 Through October 31, 2020, a total of 17,556 Quilts of Valor quilts have been awarded.

Since that time, specifications have been made regarding membership to the organization. Group membership has become costly, along with each member of the group paying a membership. These funds allow the Foundation to carry the administrative costs for acquiring licenses, permits, newed corporate filings, covering events general liability coverage. It is illegal for anyone to award a quilt under the Quilts of Valor lery (Parachutist) name without belonging to a franchised Quilts of Valor group.

There are strict requirements for construction of Quilts of Valor quilts. They must be labeled with required information, must be AWARDED (this is NOT a gift), and must be recorded by the Group. The group sends the veteran's name in to the National Headquarters where they are then Pam Crow listed on the National Quilts of Valor Registry.
